Marianne is an International Board Certified Lactation Consultant working nationally and internationally with programs that protect, promote and support breastfeeding. She is co-author and facilitator of the "Breastfeeding; Making a Difference" Courses for health professionals, and has provided "train the trainer" courses for clinical educators in three provinces in Canada. Marianne is currently serving on the WHO/UNICEF Network for BFHI Coordinators in Industrialized Countries, and is a UNICEF Master Educator and Master Assessor in the international BFHI hospital accreditation program. She is a Lead Assessor and past chair of the Breastfeeding Committee for Canada, and co-chair of the BC Baby-Friendly Network.
