

Human Milk's Advantage

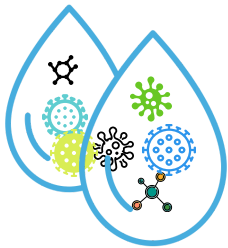
Human milk is the normal food for infant feeding
