- Educating communities about the infant's right to breastfeed anywhere, anytime in Canada
- Facilitating education for health care providers, community, and agency partners regarding the "BCC BFI Integrated 10 Steps Practice Outcome Indicators for Hospitals and Community Health Services" and the International Code of Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes and all subsequent relevant WHA resolutions
- Facilitating support and awareness around options for women returning to school or to work

### We Support Breastfeeding by:

- Facilitating the implementation of the Baby-Friendly Initiative (BFI) in Alberta
- Encouraging policy development based on current evidence based research
- Encouraging education and skills development applicable to the role of all healthcare providers and facility staff
- Supporting initiatives to increase rates of exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months and the duration of breastfeeding into the second year of life and beyond
- Encouraging the establishment of peer support programs
- Facilitating networking between agencies, teams and organizations that provide services to breastfeeding families
